Diseases Of The Ureter There may be obstructions due to congenital atresia or to various diseases and neoplasms. The result of such a condition is a dilatation of the ureter above the obstruction and of the kidney (hydronephrosis).

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Diseases Of The Ureter

Urine formed in the kidneys flows through the ureters into the bladder, but it does not flow passively. The ureters push each small amount of urine along in waves of contraction, at low pressure. At the bladder, each ureter passes through an opening in the bladder wall, which closes when the bladder contracts to prevent urine from flowing back ...

If symptoms do occur, it is usually in the case of complete duplicated ureters. Duplicated ureters can occur with other abnormalities of the urinary system. One of the more common is ureterocele. With this condition, the end of the ureter does not develop properly, and urine flow is obstructed.

Vascular (blood vessel) disease and blood clots. Gastrointestinal (GI) issues such as Crohn's disease, diverticulitis or swollen appendix. Ureteral stones, which are kidney stones that move to the ureter. Genetic disorders that cause narrowing of the ureter (ureteral stricture) or other abnormalities of the urinary tract.

The ureters can be affected by a number of diseases; including urinary tract infections and kidney stone. Stenosis is when a ureter is narrowed, due to for example chronic inflammation. Congenital abnormalities that affect the ureters can include the development of two ureters on the same side, or abnormally placed ureters.

acute or chronic bacterial infection of the kidneys and the lining of the collecting system (kidney pelvis) - acute pyelonephritis: has moderate to severe symptoms that last 1-2 weeks. if treatment of acute is unsuccessful and the infection recurs, it is termed chronic pyelonephritis
