The Italian film-maker Pier Paolo Pasolini was first and always a poet-the most important civil poet, according to Alberto Moravia, in Italy in the second half of this century. His poems were at once deeply personal and passionately engaged in the political turmoil of his country. In 1949, after his homosexuality led the Italian Communist Party to expel him on charges of "moral and political unworthiness," Pasolini fled to Rome. This selection of poems from his early impoverished days on the outskirts of Rome to his last (with a backward longing glance at his native Frill) is at the center of his poetic and filmic vision of modern Italian life as an Inferno. Pier Paolo Pasolini was born in 1922 in Bologna. In addition to the films for which he is world famous, he wrote novels, poetry, and social and cultural criticism. He was murdered in 1975.

Set in the American West during the California Gold Rush, *La fanciulla del West* marked a significant departure from Giacomo Puccini's previous and best-known works. *Puccini and the Girl* is the first book to explore this important but often misunderstood opera that became the earliest work by a major European composer to receive an American premiere when it opened at New York's Metropolitan Opera House in 1910. Adapted from American playwright David Belasco's Broadway production, *The Girl of the Golden West*, *Fanciulla* was Puccini's most consciously modern work, and its Met debut received mixed reviews. Annie J. Randall and Rosalind Gray Davis base their account of its creation on previously unknown letters from Puccini to his main librettist, Carlo Zangarini. They mine musical materials, newspaper accounts, and rare photographs and illustrations to tell the full story of this controversial opera. *Puccini and the Girl* considers the production and reception of Puccini's "cowboy" opera in the light of contemporary criticism, providing both fascinating insight into its history and a look to the future as its centenary approaches. Primo Levi has been identified in the public mind as the supreme witness to the barbarism that was the Nazi Holocaust but he was ambivalent about having that role thrust upon him. He also wished to be judged as a writer who, in addition to the autobiographical works on his experiences in the death camps, wrote poetry, produced volumes of sci-fi stories, authored novels and contributed critical essays to newspapers on a range of topics and writers. No one has the right to ignore or downplay the 'testimony' Primo Levi offered, but it is time to examine the wider vision inherent in his work and to explore the tradition in which he operated. Levi was one of the great wisdom writers of his age, whose ethical authority, somewhat to his own embarrassment, was accepted in many fields. Several contributors to this collection of essays see him as a proponent of Enlightenment values, or as heir to a longer Humanist tradition. Even after enduring Auschwitz, he held fast to a notion of the dignity of the human person, and no man did more to re-establish, however quizzically, the secular basis for such beliefs. His overall standing as writer is the subject of this book.

Avviato agli studi di giurisprudenza dal padre – Carlo Bersezio, un giudice di tendenze liberali – frequenta fin da adolescente i circoli letterari della capitale sabauda. Esordisce quattordicenne con un primo lavoro teatrale, *Le male lingue*, che conoscerà successivamente una discreta fortuna sotto il nuovo titolo *Una bolla di sapone* (Milano 1876). Il suo vero esordio teatrale avviene al Carignano di Torino nella stagione 1852/1853 con i drammi *Pietro Micca* e *Romolo* in cui gli ideali patriottici venivano adattati ai canoni classici dell'arte drammatica. Quasi come una sorta di basso continuo la sua opera (per il resto fortemente debitrice a influenze d'oltralpe, da Dumas a Hugo, Balzac, Sue) è percorsa da una vena umoristica e satirica. Assumendo nel 1854 la direzione del *Fischietto*, uno dei più importanti periodici satirici d'Italia, riscuote un'ampia notorietà.

Il capolavoro riconosciuto di Bersezio è la commedia piccolo-borghese *Le miserie di Monsù Travet* (rappresentata a Torino al Teatro Alfieri il 4 aprile 1863 dalla compagnia di Giovanni Toselli) che ebbe a suo tempo gli elogi di Manzoni, mentre il nome del suo protagonista Travet o Travetti venne accolto nel Dizionario di Petrocchi come sinonimo di «piccolo burocrate», «impiegatuccio» ed era ancora ampiamente usato fino agli anni settanta del XX secolo.
