A guild is a metaphor for all walks of life, most importantly a group of people working together to craft works of balance, beauty, and utility. Wilmeth Active Learning Center—a potential new Purdue icon. William Carol Latta was the 13th member of the Purdue faculty. He became the driving force behind Purdue's world-famous School of Agriculture and initiated extension services that have lasted for more than a century. In 1890, he laid out the first permanent soil fertility field experiments, inaugurating a system of research considered one of the best in the country at that time. He administered Purdue's School of Agriculture until 1907.
