The Hebrew work is called Ecclesiasticus, in the Latin Bible and in Greek manuscripts Sophia Iēsou hyiou Sirach (the Wisdom of Jesus the Son of Sirach); the original Hebrew title was probably Ḥokhmat Yeshua' Ben-Sira, the Wisdom of Ben-Sira.
