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### Theory And Application Of Health

The Theory uses knowledge (of the health risks and benefits), perceived self-efficacy (that one can exercise control over one's health habits), outcome expectations (expected costs and benefits), goals (health goals), and, lastly, perceived knowledge of health risks and benefits (create the precondition of the desired change) (5). In other words, people need to have knowledge on how their lifestyle, for example, affects their life, before starting to make a plan to change it.

### Applications to Health - Social Cognitive Theory

Models and theories can provide a framework for program planners to build upon as they develop health promotion programming. This publication discusses three models or theories related to health behavior change that can help planners design effective health promotion programs: socioecological, transtheoretical, and health belief.
