Human error typology. Failures of action, or unintentional actions, are classified as skill-based errors. This error type is categorised into slips of action and lapses of memory. Failures in planning are referred to as mistakes, which are categorised as rule-based mistakes and knowledge-based mistakes.

Second, it acknowledges the reality that human behavior is inherently variable, so there is no point in expecting or requiring perfect behavior 100% of the time. If the system is not designed with sufficient tolerance to accommodate normal user behavior and variability, then "normal" users will make "errors".
